They also enjoyed two lovely long sessions of outdoor free-flow with Reception. During games the Year 6 children came to help and it is always so lovely to see the bond between the oldest and youngest children in the school. We are also hopeful that some children in Year 6 will start visiting the Nursery and Reception classes more regularly after half-term to help with reading.

Forest School

The children had the most wonderful time at Wimbledon Common this week. They walked up a very steep hill and enjoyed clambering and climbing all over the huge fallen trees. They also created some wonderful 'nature crowns' using objects that they collected.







Project

During our project all about the Water Princess last week the children learnt all about Gigi, who had to travel for miles each day to collect clean water. The children engaged in several problem-solving activities such as using a cloth filter to clean water, balancing a bucket of 'water' on their heads and building a well. This week the children learnt all about 'Spike" the Axolotyl. They began the activity by reading a story all about an Axolotyl, learning all about its habitat and some fun facts and their anatomy. They also had a look at images and short videos on YouTube of axolotls in their natural habitat. Later they created their own axolotl puppets using paper bags. The children also enjoyed learning some further Spanish words and the names of some native Mexican animals. 



