What a wonderful fortnight we have enjoyed in Nursery. The children have enjoyed being outside more as the weather has finally started to warm up and your little ones are really becoming quite grown up and mature. They have also been enjoying our topic of 'Splish, Splash, Splosh' and have really amazed us with their ability to recall quite complex facts and new words. We have a few exciting things coming up, including a dinosaur workshop next week and stay tuned for news of some more exciting water themed activities in the next couple of weeks.

The children have been busy as always and particularly enjoyed 'fixing' a 'leak' in our home corner. They have also enjoyed engaging in some hospital role-play, taking temperatures and bandaging sore limbs.

We have been focusing a lot on shape and pattern and the children have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes through exploration and construction activities.

We were treated to some amazing sights, including a group of moorhen chicks and even a terrapin on Queensmere pond. They loved sitting at the edge of the water, taking this all in and chatting about what they could see. They were particularly interested in the size of the lily pads and were excited about how big the pond was.

We also had a go at creating shapes with leaves, twigs and stones to link with our work during the week on shape.


Books
