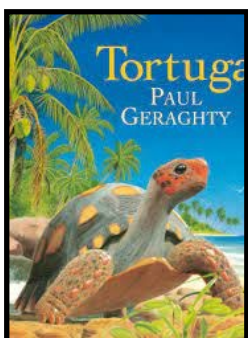
The book concerns a girl called Sophie, her mother, and a tiger who invites himself to their afternoon tea and consumes all the food and drink they have.

Oliver Jeffers

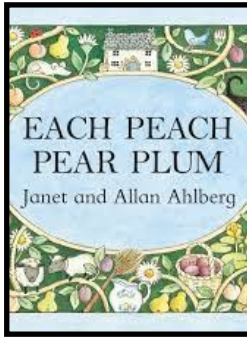
